



## FACT SHEET

### Common Flyboard® Tricks

- **Dolphin Dive:** diving forward into the water from a height less than 20ft
- **Huge Dolphin:** diving forward into the water from a height greater than 20ft
- **Back Dolphin:** diving backwards into the water from any height
- **Backflip:** single back flip where a Pilot clears the trick without the board touching the surface of the water
- **Flying backwards:** flying backwards while moving
- **Back-to-Back:** two back flips done in succession during a single ascent or descent. Identified specifically by the 'pause' between the first and second back flip
- **Threading the needle:** a back flip, then immediately flying or diving through the loop of the hose.
- **Slalom:** moving the Flyboard® aggressively from side to side while maintaining forward momentum. Each slalom puts the jets of water from the Flyboard® almost parallel to the water's surface
- **Whippy:** when the Flyboard pilot does such a massive and high dolphin, it whips the hose so aggressively that it pulls the personal water craft (PWC) right out of the water - a rare but epic trick

### Flyboard® Rules and Regs

Flyboarding is a new sport in Canada with established rules and regulations. If you want to try the sport, be sure to visit <http://www.flyboardcanada.com> for more information and safety precautions before you take to the water.

- Flyboard® Canada states that you must be 18 years of age or older to use the Flyboard® (16-18 requires signature from legal guardian)
- A Flyboard can be used on any Personal Water Craft (PWC) provided that is approved and certified by the authorities of the country of use. The PWC power requirement is 100hp (horsepower) up to a maximum of 300hp.
- The Flyboard® must be used only by one person. It is strictly forbidden to be two or more persons on the Flyboard®.
- To become a sole Flyboard® operator in Canada, it is mandatory to do a minimum of a 1.5 hour practical training course in a Flyboard® Canada authorized training center, and/or with a Flyboard® Canada or BCFlyboard Inc. authorized instructor. The course allows users to understand the basic concepts of Flyboarding and safety. Operators must hold a valid safe boaters card.
